## **Topher Allan Music Teaching Philosophy**

As educators, our role is to provide a safe and welcoming environment for students to learn and grow. It is important for learning to take place in such an environment so that students are both free to be themselves, and free to make mistakes. This way, mistakes happen in a safe, forgiving environment where students can learn from them before they have to learn those lessons in the real world. It is crucial that educators prepare students to be high-functioning members of society when they leave the sheltered environment of school, regardless of what their roles or vocations may be.

The most important gift we can give our students is an education that is student-centered. In order for students to learn, they must be involved in their own education and have a say in what they are learning and how they learn and demonstrate that learning. The best learning happens when it is cooperative and collaborative in nature, letting students learn from each other and become more actively engaged in their learning. We make it a point to take into account our students' interests and learning styles as we teach, as well as provide students with multiple means of demonstrating their learning.

As teachers, our goal is to be facilitators of learning and mediators of dialogue rather than simply telling students what we want them to know. We believe we can learn just as much from our students as they can learn from us, so we want to be sure to show them as much respect as they give us by allowing a free flow of students' ideas and interpretations. This is done by allowing students some input in choosing the music that they perform, as well as specific content they want to learn. Music can drive certain emotions and a certain piece can mean something different to each person. We want to validate our students and their feelings about a piece by allowing them to share their personal connections so that students are able to combine their various experiences to create a deeper and broader interpretation of a piece.
